## Basic Safety Requirements for Spontaneous Flood Clean-Up Volunteers

## 1. Pre-Deployment Briefing / Toolbox Talk

- Mandatory safety briefing before work begins (Toolbox Talk).
- Cover:
  - Key hazards (contaminated water, sewage and chemicals, unstable structures, electrical risks, dusts
  - o Personal protective equipment (PPE) requirements.
  - Manual handling techniques
  - Decontamination especially prior to eating personnel hygiene expectations
  - o Fatigue management minimise shift times
  - Slips trips and falls
  - o Emergency contacts and procedures.
  - o Work zones and restricted areas.
  - o Buddy system expectations.

## 2. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Volunteers must be equipped with:

- Gloves heavy-duty, waterproof (if available), and puncture-resistant.
- Boots waterproof (preferably steel-capped) for protection from debris, mud, and water.
- Long-sleeved shirts and long pants to reduce skin exposure to contaminants.
- High-visibility vests for visibility around machinery and vehicles.
- Eye protection for tasks involving debris, high-pressure cleaning, or chemicals.
- Face masks / respirators especially where there is mould, dust, or chemical exposure. Minimum P2
- Sun protection hat, sunscreen (SPF 30+), sunglasses if working outdoors.

### 3. Hygiene and Decontamination

- Handwashing stations or sanitiser available at all sites.
- Decontamination process before eating, drinking, or finishing shift:
  - o Wash hands and exposed skin.
  - Rinse and disinfect reusable tools and PPE.
  - Remove muddy or contaminated clothing before entering vehicles or homes.
- Avoid touching face, mouth, or eyes during clean-up.
- Tetanus vaccinations should be up to date.

#### 4. Health and Safety Guidelines

- No one under 18 should be involved in flood debris clean-up.
- Volunteers must be physically capable of performing the assigned tasks.
- Take regular breaks, stay hydrated, and avoid over-exertion.

- Do not enter flooded buildings or confined spaces unless cleared and authorised by emergency services.
- Electrical and gas hazards must be reported—do not touch live wires or attempt repairs.
- Report all injuries or hazards to site supervisors immediately.

## 5. Supervision and Coordination

- Volunteers should be registered and assigned to a supervised team.
- Work in pairs (buddy system) and if possible, with emergency services personnel for accountability.
- Supervisors should be trained in first aid and emergency response.
- Volunteers must follow instructions from emergency services or authorised personnel at all times.

# Safety Requirements for Volunteers – Flood Clean-UpOperations

Your safety is our priority. Before assisting with flood clean-up, please read and follow the safety guidelines below.

## 🛂 Before You Start: Toolbox Talk

- Attend a mandatory safety briefing before commencing work.
- Understand:
  - o Hazards (e.g. contaminated water, unstable structures, electrical risks)
  - Safe work practices
  - o Emergency procedures
  - o Buddy system and site layout

# Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) – Must Wear:

- **Waterproof gloves** (puncture-resistant)
- Waterproof boots (steel-capped recommended)
- State Long-sleeved shirt & pants
- III Hi-vis vest
- Mask / respirator (especially around mould or dust)
- Eye protection & sun protection (hat, sunscreen, sunglasses)

# Hygiene & Decontamination

- Wash hands regularly especially before eating or drinking
- Do NOT touch face during clean-up
- Change out of wet/muddy clothing before entering cars or homes
- Rinse tools and PPE after use
- Ensure tetanus vaccination is up to date

## **A** Safety Guidelines

- Minimum age: 18 years old
- Stay hydrated, take regular breaks
- Report injuries or hazards immediately
- Never enter flooded buildings or confined spaces unless cleared
- Avoid electrical/gas hazards report and keep clear
- Always work in pairs use the buddy system

## **&** Supervision & Support

- All volunteers must be registered
- Work under supervision
- Follow directions from emergency services and site leaders
